
Abrams Fensterman, LLP Makes History with First NY Voting Rights Act Lawsuit

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Abrams Fensterman is representing five Hispanic voters from Mount Pleasant, New York, and has filed [the first lawsuit under the New York Voting Rights Act](#). This case is the first lawsuit filed under the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Act, named after the late Georgia congressman and civil rights champion.

The lawsuit alleges that Mount Pleasant's voting system violates the New York Voting Rights Act by preventing Hispanic voters from electing candidates of their choice to the town board, despite their significant presence in the community.
