

Maureen Bass Represents Suspended Alfred Police Chief – Media Coverage

Abrams Fensterman Partner [Maureen Bass](#) was recently featured in multiple news outlets, commenting on her representation of recently suspended Alfred Police Chief Paul Griffith.

The coverage explains that issues leading to Chief Griffith's suspension appear to have arisen after he recommended a young veteran, who had just completed the first phase of police academy, for a part-time officer position in the department. Notably, this candidate would have been the first African American officer in the department's history.

In the [ABC7 article](#), Bass is quoted asking, "How did you one day be the respected, loved chief of the village, and then the next day, not be?"

The [Evening Tribune](#) quoted Bass "Griffith wants to remain police chief, saying he loves the area, the town and the people he serves."
