Michael Bass, a partner in the [Albany office](#) of Abrams Fensterman, was recently interviewed by [CBS News 6 Albany](#) regarding the legal implications of a reported proposal by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to establish a national autism registry.

Bass explained the potential privacy concerns associated with such a registry. While HIPAA permits the use of personal health information for research purposes under certain conditions, Mr. Bass noted that these provisions typically require approval from institutional review boards and privacy boards to ensure appropriate oversight.

“It’s all about your personal privacy information, your healthcare information. People don’t want other people to know about their healthcare issues.”
